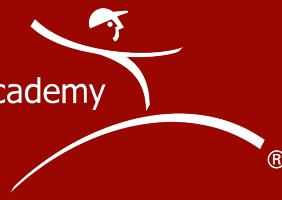

Liverpool Cathedral the biggest church in UK

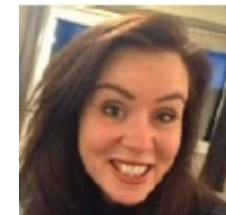

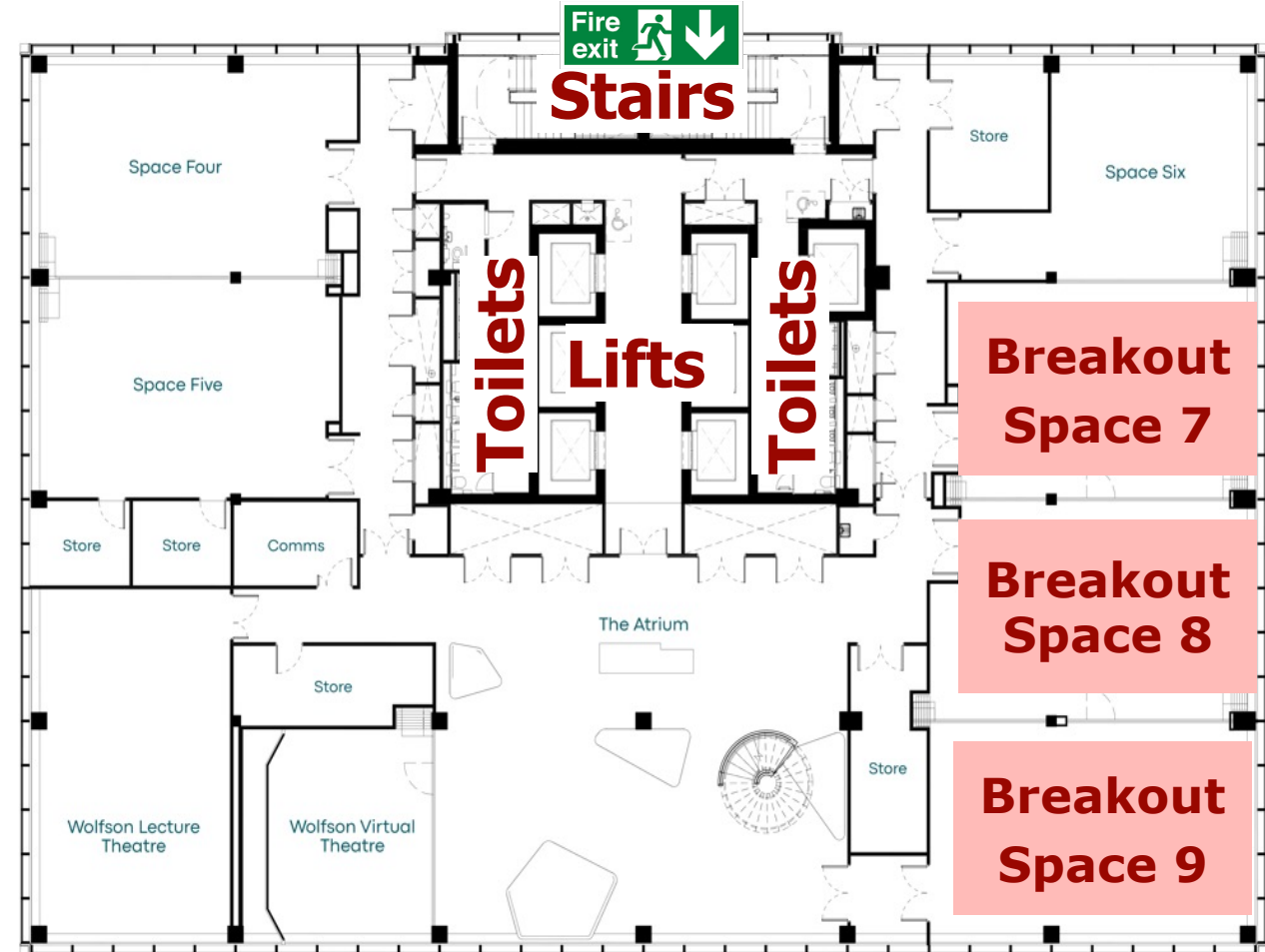

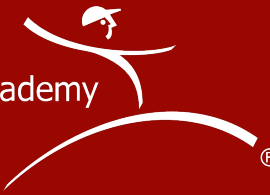
Location Orientation

 - We all consume information, on demand



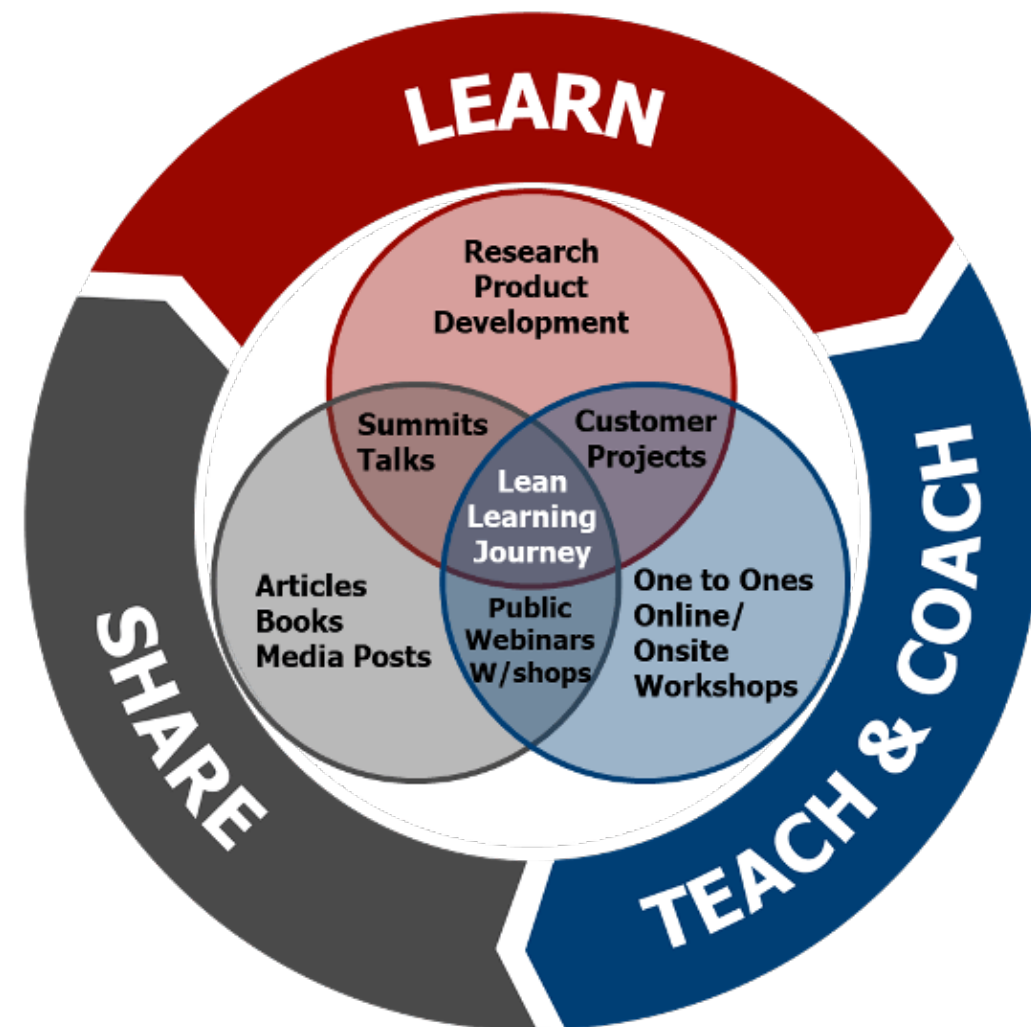
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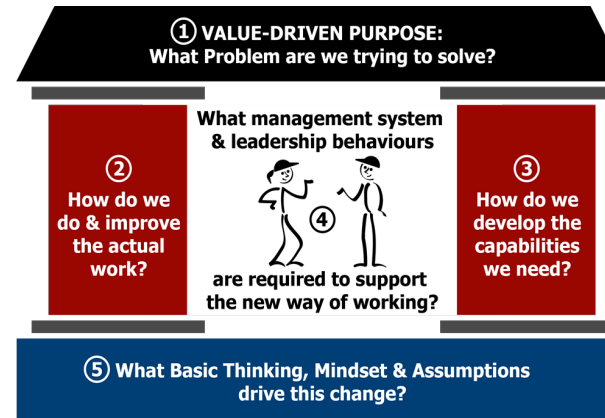
